



There has been a lot of goings on at Jack's Boatyard this summer as many in the community are well aware. So, what is actually going on at the boatyard? There is a large demand for do it yourself dry storage for boats. They always have a waiting list for the winter and with the closing of the north harbour in Powell River the boatyard decided to do something about it.

The blasting to increase the land space to store boats is done. Now they are sorting the rocks; spreading and packing. The boatyard has gone from being able to house 40 boats to 80 boats this year and next winter they will be able to store 100 boats. They are also upgrading the power system to a 30 amp connection. There are plans to build a long shed building along Finn Bay Road. This in demand Lund business is forward thinking and preparing for the future. SPAGHETTI SQUASH PIZZA

CUT 1 SPAGHETTI SQUASH IN 1/2 LENGTH WISE. BAKE FACE DOWN IN OVEN UNTIL SQUASH CAN BE PEELED AWAY WITH FORK.

MIX SQUASH WITH 2 EGGS, PARMESAN OR ROMANO CHEESE (OR ANY OTHER KIND OF DRY CHEESE) AND PESTO. SPREAD OUT FLAT ON BAKING PAN AND BAKE UNTIL MOSTLY FIRM.

ADD PREFERRED TOPPINGS AND CHEESE (I'VE USED SUNDRIED TOMATOES, ROASTED VEGGIES (ROAST THEM WHILE ROASTING THE SQUASH), ARTICHOKES AND BLACK OLIVES). BAKE AGAIN UNTIL CHEESE IS MELTED.

POTATO PANCAKES

GRATE 2 LARGE POTATOES COARSELY.
RINSE GRATED POTATO, DRAIN, PAT DRY
AND TRANSFER TO BOWL.

GRATE 1 ONION OVER POTATOES.

SPRINKLE WITH 1 TBSP FLOUR, ADD 2

BEATEN EGGS, SALT AND PEPPER TO TASTE.


STIR TO COMBINE.

POUR ENOUGH OIL IN THE PAN TO COVER
THE BOTTOM AND PLACE OVER MODERATE
HEAT. ONCE OIL IS HOT, PLACE
TABLESPOONS OF POTATO; FLATTENING
WITH SPOON. FRY UNTIL PANCAKES ARE
CRISP AND BROWN (ABOUT 3 MINUTES).

On July 17, Northside Area "A" residents voted 80% in favour of borrowing a maximum of \$645,592 to build a new fire hall. The new hall will replace the existing Craig Road Hall which is located at the centre of the Northside Fire Protection Area.

The project is going out to tender and, once a contractor has been selected, construction will begin. The new hall will house Northside's newest pumper truck and two tanker trucks, with room for a future Emergency First Response Vehicle.

The new hall has sufficient space for proper training so Northside can continue its ongoing Fire Fighter Certification process and other training as required. Volunteers are always welcome, either as fire fighters or for tasks such as filing, record keeping, hall maintenance, equipment inspections, grounds keeping, etc. Please call the Regional District at 483-3231 if this interests you. 

LUND SEWER

Remember to Vote ~ in person on October 6 and 16 ~ or by mail ballot

The Lund Sewer treatment plant experienced a major breakdown in November, 2009. The Regional District has been investigating options for correcting the problem and an upgrade plan is now in place.

The total estimated upgrade cost is \$462,195. Some funds are available in the sewer service reserve and the Regional Board has authorized a generous contribution to this project from its Community Works Fund in order to minimize borrowing and the associated debt payments which users will have to cover. (Community Works Funds are provided to local governments by the federal government from its Gas Tax revenues.) However, Regional District must borrow \$25,000 to finance the balance of the costs.

On October 16, electors in the Lund Sewer Local Service Area will vote on the following question:

"Are you in favour of the Powell River Regional District adopting Bylaw No. 438 to borrow up to \$25,000 over an amortization period of up to 15 years to upgrade the Lund Sewer Treatment Plant?

Financing & Taxation Information associated with this borrowing bylaw:

The estimated annual debt payment is \$2,670.

The estimated parcel tax increase to cover the debt payment is \$26.

The maximum borrowing term is 15 years.

For more information on the upgrades, financing and costs, see the flyer mailed to the service area on September 16. The flyer is also posted on the Regional District's website.

WHO CAN VOTE

The only electors who can vote are those who are, on October 16, Canadian citizens, at least 18 years of age and who have lived in BC for 6 months and who have also lived or owned property in the Lund Sewer Area for 30 days.
